DUKE DROPS IN ON WALTHAM ABBEY ABOARD HELICOPTER



WITH out-stretched hand Prince Richard, Duke of Gloucester, steps out of a Wessex helicopter of the Queen's Flight which touched down at the top-secret Ministry of Defence PERME grounds in Waltham Abbey last Thursday. He is greeted by the Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Sir Andrew Lewis.

Prince Richard, the chief ranger of Epping Forest, toured the town's Defence Ministry's Propellants, Explosives and Rocket Motor Establishments on a goodwill visit to help him become better acquainted with the Epping Forest area.
