


CHART GUNPOWDER MILLS, FAVERSHAM, KENT

The oldest of their kind in the world

The edge runner mill illustrated forms a part of the Chart Powder Mills at St. Anns. Faversham. The breast-shot iron wheel. 16 ft. 2 in. in diameter, originally served a pair of mills. Of the machinery of the second, which would have occupied the left hand background of the drawing, only the pit wheel survives, and this has been omitted. The primary drive is transmitted through a bevelled wallower to the vertical iron shaft, and thence, by spur gearing, to a second shaft of timber, around which the edge runner stones revolve. Scale in metres.
