pendant weight all the omnes, and a halfe a quartes, for fyso thorsand and fybe hundrefde pounds, to be paied for the same
warres and fneles accordinge as in his formes offer is contyned.

whereas my fiftie art for ordynge as in his booke of his responyses is contained
Mylnes offes I have wryghte made to reforme vs yowre good wills and falsho; and vnder the name of yo^e Exarvis dycient in his behalfe
into my fiftene, even for any benefite that shall our will wryght therof to me; comfytte that yo^e may one daye will haue in remembraunce
my good wills

And for that purpos of somme information that is I will sente yo yrete of the said bovstales at the pris of re to the boderlye
and the boves made about hornes at ym to the boderlye, the brymstone assygnynge the boderlye; accordinge to the p[ri]ce rated
by m[aster] broomefeld lewesmente of yowre maist[er] ordenant; that then y[ou]r proposed yowre ma will have them v[er]y s[oon] & I am also
verysy to accomplish; by cause I amy desirous to be rebld ffrecess d[omi]n[ic] for the same I am tenuis [and] remayns in the handes
of them whom yowr kyngis shall thens best by the achayme of the accomplishment of this purgation for the money &
chancie verelye sente by me my boves before, and as þis þyme as I dale home confygnd þe monte thereof, that then
þe same ffeild to be spred by two indiferent plowes, that is to saye, þe one to be elected by yo[ur] sware assygnis, and þe oþer by me
or my assygnis d[omi]n[ic] the same two named ffrecess aynt, þen þe same two to tense alhode þis þe, and testifying two of þem
þe oþer agree, þen yo[ur] kyngis to write þe same þis accordinge to þis valuation, and to paye for þe þyme as for þe same
yarde in maner followinge

And for remeige as I am informed that ye shall not stande w^t yo^r ma^r comoditie presently to dispense wedye monoy for red^e &
white spawte w^t t^e same goodes shall amonst unto, w^t wilbe to my great discomoditie yet I willbe content to receyve for y^r grace
a warrant for t^e same white spawte, to dedmke t^e same t^e white part^e appelle of t^e custome of here, and other goodes appelle brought
into t^e realme as t^e tuckeyd out by me my assynd or bindes to be dedmke at t^e rate as straungres do pay^e vnt^e t^e white
amonst t^e a thousand flourre t^e underlyng leye before and t^e same pomdes sterlinge.

Declaringe to youre ma^tre^cat for my affynes shall sent in sufficient shertnes for the valle^e of the said yedes hys falbe very bed
dayly, whiche shal be made confirmation of the said byronstone and honestales.

And for other Ryndys etc at the dethlyere of the same in ready money.

Item as for my self & for my sonne offered to serue for my lord a hundred & twenty weight, and yowre ma
haste set for my selfe mth if it may be possible to gette a barge to transport y^t from the Realme of Nopelle, for the same
to be made in halide, but to be shute uppon & our my assynd Calle certifie that I will furnysh the quyltynge
so madly well hym, so hym the barge pleynly money costynge in good and suffynt perteis to make conuynacion
and for rest at the delþorȝ fereys.
