

Soveraign Lord Charles the Second by the Gracve of God of England Scotland ffrance and Ireland Kinge and defendor of the ffaith Anno Dom 1669 Betweene theWilliam Earle of Bedford Sir John Kelynge Knight Lord Cheife Justice of his Majesties court of Kings Bench Sir James Altham of Latton in the county of Essex Knight of the Bath Sir John Gore of Sacombe in the county of Hertford Knight and Sir
