But ruthless criminals expect vigorous interrog

SKILFUL and ruthless criminals could only expect "vigorous" interrogation at the hands of the police, an Appeal Court judge said on Friday.

But the treatment afforded to a suspect in a series of ammonia attacks on security guards after his arrest by robbery squad officers was such that it would be quite unsafe to say that his will was not "overborne."

Lord Justice O'Connor.

sitting with Lord Justice May and Mr. Justice Hollings, was commenting in giving the Appeal Court's reasons for clearing car dealer Mr. Daniel Gowan last October.

Mr. Gowan, aged 52, of Clarendon Road, Cheshunt, iailed for 25 years at the Old pailed for 25 years at the Old Bailey in July 1979, for robbery and conspiracy to rob after being implicated by a "supergrass," then had his convictions quashed and sentence set aside and was

Lord Justice O'Connor said the case highlighted the difficulties faced by the police and courts in dealing with skilful and ruthless criminals.

A special robbery squad was formed after a series of attacks on security guards in 1977 in Kent, Hertfordshire, Nottingham and Birmingham, and a planned raid at the Schweppes factory in Colindale.

Mr. Gowan was arrested in a dawn raid at his home on November 8, 1977, and taken to Barnet Police Station.

But he was not told the reason for his arrest, in con-travention of Judges' Rules, and his detention there until November 15 virtually amounted to him being held incommunicado to make him crack, said the judge.

He was denied access to his lawyers and repeatedly interrogated. He had foods, having appa gone on hunger strike.
